## **Report on One day FDP program**

Shri Murli Manohar Town Post Graduate College, Ballia organized a one-day Faculty Development Programme on "National Education Policy-2020: Implementation, Issues and Solutions" on 15.11.2022 under the auspices of its Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). The programme was inaugurated by the Principal Professor Ravindra Nath Mishra with the lighting of the lamp and worship of the Maa Saraswati. The programme was conducted by Professor Rama Kant Singh member of IQAC, who provided a brief introduction to all the speakers, and welcomed all the professors present in the conference hall.

The first speaker, Dr. Sandip Kumar Pandey, Assistant Professor Department of Agricultural Economics, expressed his thoughts on the "Promotion of students in Semester system in NEP-2020". The National Education Policy will promote independence or self-reliance in education, focus on education related to quality and relevancy, encourage analytical and creative thinking, and inspire students to become responsible and self-reliant citizens in human context. Quality and relevance is the cornerstone of education, where human skills and interests, technological management and social and professional features all come together. It is important to identify the role of key drivers in this context who contribute or hinder the improvement of quality and relevance in educational institutions at the academic level. The world is facing complex and dynamic challenges such as globalization, technological changes, environmental degradation, etc. The National Education Policy aims to create a holistic and multidisciplinary education system that equips students with the skills and knowledge necessary to deal with these challenges.

The second speaker, Dr. Jitendra Kumar Verma, Assistant Professor from the Department of Defence and Strategic Studies gave a lecture on "Criteria for Selection of Core Subject: major & minor". He said that in today's rapidly changing world, it is necessary for all students to learn some subjects and skills to become a successful and productive person. In addition to proficiency in languages, these skills include scientific facts and research based on evidence. Now, students will choose subjects in which they have a special interest. The university will see each student's personal subject portfolio and provide them with admission in their curriculum according to their interests and abilities. Every

student has some innate abilities, which should be identified and nourished. These abilities can express themselves as various talents. Students who show interest and competence in a specific subject area should be encouraged to go beyond the regular curriculum and study in that field. This way now, the interests of the students will be identified and methods to motivate them will be developed. In B.Ed curriculum also, special emphasis will be placed on the education of talented students. From the 2021-22 session of the university, the new education policy has started to be implemented in accordance with the new education policy, which is why the minor subjects have also been included in the new education policy. Besides their major subjects, if a student wants to take any other subject, he will also be given the opportunity. These have been referred to as minor subjects.

The Third speaker, Dr. Subodh Mani Tripathi, Assistant Professor of Defence and Strategic Studies department, discussed the "Credit and Grading System in NEP-2020 ". He addressed the concerns of the audience and explained that the students at undergraduate level have been provided with many facilities according to the National Education Policy from the academic session 2021-22. The maximum duration to complete a three-year undergraduate course has now been increased to three years and the maximum duration for completing the undergraduate course is nine years. The policy changes related to the implementation of the grading system in universities and colleges of Uttar Pradesh were also discussed.

The fourth speaker, Assistant Professor Dr. Shiv Narayan Yadav from the SDepartment of English, presented his lecture on "Promotion in NEP-2020 Criteria". He explained the methods of calculation for CGPA and SGPA, and said that under the National Education Policy, students will always be promoted from one semester to the next, regardless of the results of their current semester. The promotion from one semester to the next will be based on some conditions. The maximum duration for completing a program in a single year is three years. If a student consistently studies for three years, the maximum duration will be nine years, but if the student fails to get a certificate or diploma in one year, then the maximum duration will be three years.

In the end, of the program Convener of the program and member of IQAC, Prof. Rama Kant Singh, thanked everyone. The program was attended by Prof. Om
